

Openings for promoting PSM in Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, Tunisia

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Potential indicators – UNESCO's MDI list

1. A system of regulation conducive to freedom of expression, pluralism and diversity of the media
 - E.g. constitution, laws, media regulator
2. Plurality and diversity of media, a level economic playing field and transparency of ownership
 - E.g. licensing system
3. Media as a platform for democratic discourse
 - E.g. complaints system, editorial mandates
4. Professional capacity building and supporting institutions to underpin freedom of expression, pluralism and diversity
 - E.g. collective representation of media workers, professional training
5. Infrastructural capacity is sufficient to support independent and pluralistic media
 - E.g. public access to digital media

Relevant recent developments?

- Media regulators
 - Morocco's HACA = vice president of MNRA in 2019, will host plenary
 - Tunisia's HAICA twinned with Belgian CSA
 - Lebanon's CNA – exchanges with European regulators and HACA
 - Jordan Media Commission and RFC response to Netflix *Jinn* outcry
 - Council of Europe Southern Neighbourhood programme with Jordan, Morocco, Tunisia
- Editorial mandates
 - EU/UNESCO Support to Media in Jordan – Al-Mamlaka tv news channel launched 2018 as 'neither state-owned nor commercial'
- Journalism unions
 - Tunisia's SNJT
